Yes, GCMTA is strong and well because of the many good members who volunteer to make our events and committees run smoothly and effectively. We are very student-oriented and also encourage each other well. Some things we did this year are:

- --We went green (paperless) with our handbook & registrations for events plus have a password protected website.
- --We ran three National Federated Festivals where we awarded \$3200 in scholarship monies to further music education for 12 winning students,
- -- We had a Jr/Sr Scholarship which awarded \$2000 to 4 winners

winners.

- -- We nurtured new members by mentoring them and encouraging them to take roles of leadership.
- --We participated in GMTA auditions, as well as, had members who took GMTA leadership roles. --GCMTA started a Teacher of the Year Award to honor a good teacher within our ranks -to be announced and presented at our

May meeting!

- --We introduced a procedural manual to ensure that our organization remains well-run


