

Of course, luck has little to do with it as students have been preparing for weeks or months. Central Gwinnett is set for Saturday, March 10.

In order for festivals to run smoothly and not prematurely age the chairs, please make note of - and follow - these guidelines.

It is too late for literature changes.

It is too late for schedule changes unless for a last minute emergency, and then understand the request likely cannot be accommodated. It is inappropriate to send unprepared students to another festival. The ONLY students allowed to participate in a later festival are those with a legitimate conflict, and the conflict should have been apparent long ago. Please notify your chair of a small cancellation. The time slot may be used for another student.

Please don't send contagiously ill students to festival! SCJM papers should be delivered to your chair in advance of the

Please don't allow parents near the adjudication rooms.

There is no arguing with a judge's decision, even if based on genuine circumstances. The circumstances should be known before performance. If a teacher error disqualifies a student, the student may be allowed to perform again in a later festival but at teacher expense. This decision will be made after the festival has ended.

Students can be disqualified for incorrect literature selection or use of photocopies. A copy of a studio license should be available for printed literature.

All teachers entering students must work on festival day or make prior arrangements with the chair for a suitable substitute.


