### **Local Auditions**

WHERE: Piano Works WHEN: February 3, 2024

Teachers may register students to participate in GCMTA's Local Auditions by going to GMTA.org from January 1 to January 15.

GCMTA's Local Audition is the first preliminary for GMTA's Pre-College Piano competition grades 4-11 in April. Remember to register for theory at the same time as piano. Local Auditions are scheduled for February 3, 2024 at Piano Works. Local Audition winners who receive Outstanding Performer and also pass the theory test can then make a video recording of their literature to proceed to Regionals. This is due in March. The winners of Regionals proceed to an in-person adjudication at the State level. Literature requirements can be found at GMTA.org for the Pre-College Piano event. NOTE: Senior students who wish to proceed directly to State must also take the GATE (theory) exam on February 3 unless exempt.

The registration deadline for theory is the same as 4-11 graders: January 15.

# Guidelines for Teachers Performing Group A Piano Study Group

#### Purpose

The Teachers Performing Group provides a forum for piano teachers to improve their skills as musicians and teachers through self-directed study and group support. Each member will plan his/her personal musical goals and will have the opportunity to present something to the group at meetings regularly.

#### **Examples of Presentations**

- Performance of piano repertoire, any style
- A section, movement, or (time permitting) a complete work
- "Performance ready" or "in progress"
- Solo or duet repertoire; accompaniment (preferably with soloist present; improvisation; original composition

Generally speaking, each presentation may last up to 10 minutes, depending upon the number of participants that day. If any member has an upcoming performance and needs extra time, he/she should tell the coordinator before the meeting.

No critiques will be given after a performance unless requested by the performer. However, since this is a teachers group, discussions about related teaching issues (technique, style, editions, etc.) can be a valuable part of our meetings.

#### Membership

Membership is open to any pianist/teacher who will commit to the goals of the group and who will participate regularly (but not necessarily at each meeting).

#### **MUSIC DAY**

We are looking forward to starting our performance year in GCMTA with Music Day. It will be held November 11, 2023, at the First Baptist Church in Duluth. Registration will open in September. Please check our website for updates later this month.

Entry is \$25 per student, and \$10 for each additional event entered. Events include piano solo, duets, trios, and ensembles. Voice categories are Art Song and Musical Theater. Guitar categories include solo, duets, trios, and ensembles. Flute, Clarinet, and other instruments are also welcome. If you wish to enter a student in a category or instrument not mentioned above, or have any other questions, please feel free to contact Kathy Dawal.

Make sure to check repertoire requirements on the website before assigning literature to your students.

And if you have any questions on literature, check first. Each instrument has slightly different requirements. Even for beginning students, two different composers are required. For piano solo, arrangements and folksongs are not allowed. Please, please, please, check first, then assign. We want this event to be a successful one for students and their teachers.

As usual, we will try to schedule siblings as close to each other as possible. Make sure to specify students needing to be scheduled close together in the space provided on the online registration form. Other scheduling requests should be kept to what is necessary. This is an all day event. Virtual participation will again be an option. If a student knows of a conflict with the date, this might be the best choice. Our virtual judge is selected to be able to judge a wide range of grades and skill levels. Students who are sick the week of Music Day are welcome to switch to Virtual Performance so as not to miss out.

This year we are dividing up many of the tasks leading up to Music Day to lighten the load of those running it. Over the years, many of the teachers participating have become specialists in certain event activities.

We hope to take advantage of your experience and skills in making Music Day a success. If there is an area you particularly would like to help in, please contact Kathy Dawal.
