Local Auditions

The date for GCMTA's Local Auditions is Saturday, February 17, 2024 at Piano Works. Registration is ONLY ONLINE at GeorgiaMTA.org. The deadline is January 15. Local Auditions is the first preliminary for GMTA's State Auditions for piano students grades 4-11. Remember to also register Local Auditions students for the Auditions Theory Exam (GATE) by January 15 if not already eligible by passing the GMTA Theory Test (given at GCMTA's Music Day on November 11). Each teacher who enters students in Local Auditions is also required to work in some capacity for this event.

NOTE: Seniors must also register by the January 15 deadline but are not required to perform until the State Audition competition on April 13. Seniors also MUST take and pass the theory test to be eligible.

Local Auditions repertoire requirements: two pieces- one from Baroque or Classical period (through Beethoven), PLUS one piece from Romantic, Impressionistic, or Contemporary periods. Only original solo piano compositions will be accepted and memorization of all repertoire is required. All music must be purchased. Scores from free online music or public domain sites are NOT acceptable for GMTA Auditions. If you have questions about literature, please refer to GeorgiaMTA.org for a full listing of repertoire guidelines.

Only students who receive an Outstanding Performer rating AND pass the theory test requirement will be eligible to continue on to the second preliminary round which is referred to as Regionals (regional evaluation is through video recordings only). The final Audition is a state level competition on April 13 at Piedmont University which will be an in-person adjudication.

Junior/Senior Scholarship

The Junior/Senior Scholarship event will take place on Saturday, April 20, 2024, at PianoWorks in Duluth. The entry deadline is March 15, 2024, and registration is now online. Information and requirements are posted online at

Guidelines for Teachers Performing Group A Piano Study Group

Purpose

The Teachers Performing Group provides a forum for piano teachers to improve their skills as musicians and teachers through self-directed study and group support. Each member will plan his/her personal musical goals and will have the opportunity to present something to the group at meetings regularly.

Examples of Presentations

- Performance of piano repertoire, any style
- A section, movement, or (time permitting) a complete work
- "Performance ready" or "in progress"
- Solo or duet repertoire; accompaniment (preferably with soloist present; improvisation; original composition

Generally speaking, each presentation may last up to 10 minutes, depending upon the number of participants that day. If any member has an upcoming performance and needs extra time, he/she should tell the coordinator before the meeting.

No critiques will be given after a performance unless requested by the performer. However, since this is a teachers group, discussions about related teaching issues (technique, style, editions, etc.) can be a valuable part of our meetings.

Membership

Membership is open to any pianist/teacher who will commit to the goals of the group and who will participate regularly (but not necessarily at each meeting).

When, Where, Etc.

The group will meet every month, year round, at PianoWorks in Duluth. Meetings will generally be held on the third Friday of each month, although the date is subject to change in case of conflict with other events at PianoWorks. Doors will open at 10:00AM; meetings will begin promptly at 10:15 AM and conclude by noon. It is not practical for children to attend.

NFMC

Teacher's Junior (students) Club Application, Dues, and Junior Club Roster are due no later than October 15th. The application and roster are to be filled out and Junior dues paid by credit card online at http://www.georgianfmc.org/membership. Then, open the Junior Club Registration Form. Where it asks for GFMC Senior Club and Festival, enter the name of your Sr Club (West, Central, or North Gwinnett). You are the counselor of your Jr Club. The name of your Jr Club should be the same as what you submitted last year. There is a minimum fee of \$32 for 16 or less students, \$2 for each student over the minimum, and \$6 for the Keynotes magazine. Remember that only students who pay dues are eligible to participate in Festival. You can add students later, but you cannot enter students who are not on your final roster. Once you receive your confirmation receipt with roster from GFMC, it is very important to

forward that email to your Festival Chair. Typed or hand-written rosters are NOT acceptable.

CERTIFICATION

I began my certification journey in May of 2019, just before my last year of grad school at Piedmont College. I was studying under the wonderful Dr. Jeri-Mae G. Astolfi, who acted as the catalyst in getting me started on the process. Throughout the coming year, I worked on five different projects in the hopes that they would not only get me closer to achieving national certification, but that they would also help me further my understanding of pedagogy, theory, music history, and running a business (something I had only done minimally at that point, since I taught on the side and was a full-time student). In a sense, this seemed to be a much more daunting task than the capstone I would have to present at the end of my school year.

That being said, I am so glad that I went through the process and became certified. The five projects (Write Your Teaching Philosophy, Analyze Four Teaching Pieces, Present Your Teaching, Share Information About Your Teaching Environment, and Discuss Your Business Ethics and Studio Policies) each cover a different aspect of being a music teacher and helped me see where I had strengths and where I could grow. There is also something to be said for having a nationally recognized stamp at the end of my name, hopefully giving my piano studio more credibility and showing others my dedication and love for what I do. Albeit a challenging journey, it was more than worth it!
