Guidelines for Teachers Performing Group A Piano Study Group

Purpose

The Teachers Performing Group provides a forum for piano teachers to improve their skills as musicians and teachers through self-directed study and group support. Each member will plan his/her personal musical goals and will have the opportunity to present something to the group at meetings regularly.

Examples of Presentations

- Performance of piano repertoire, any style
- A section, movement, or (time permitting) a complete work
- "Performance ready" or "in progress"
- Solo or duet repertoire; accompaniment (preferably with soloist present; improvisation; original composition

Generally speaking, each presentation may last up to 10 minutes, depending upon the number of participants that day. If any member has an upcoming performance and needs extra time, he/she should tell the coordinator before the meeting.

No critiques will be given after a performance unless requested by the performer. However, since this is a teachers group, discussions about related teaching issues (technique, style, editions, etc.) can be a valuable part of our meetings.

Membership

Membership is open to any pianist/teacher who will commit to the goals of the group and who will participate regularly (but not necessarily at each meeting).

When, Where, Etc.

The group will meet every month, year round, at PianoWorks in Duluth. Meetings will generally be held on the third Friday of each month, although the date is subject to change in case of conflict with other events at PianoWorks. Doors will open at 10:00AM; meetings will begin promptly at 10:15 AM and conclude by noon.

It is not practical for children to attend.

GENERAL INFORMATION:

Each pre-college piano or piano concerto participant in GMTA's local, regional, and state auditions is **required to take and pass** one of the three (3) theory exams ("GATEs") in order to advance beyond local auditions. Students may become EXEMPT from taking some or all of the GATEs. Federated Festival

Registration will be open on December 1, 2023 - January 27, 2024 festivals.nfmc-music.org

In preparing students, please be aware of rules concerning literature choices and other important requirements.

Confirm that level choices are correct for required pieces.

Do not choose a choice piece by "Unknown" and it's best to not choose an obscure composer that may not be in the Vivace national online database.

Only original works are allowed for choice pieces. Hymns and/or American folk songs are not acceptable for Piano Solo Event.

<u>PP and PI choices must be at least 12 measures long, not including repeats. Beginning PII, all pieces must be at least 16 measures.</u>

Students must not have reached their 9th birthday to participate in PP level.

Beginning E1, choice pieces must be a non-American composer.

Teachers entering students out of district for scheduling conflicts or to participate in voice, strings competitions, etc., should register their students in their own districts and only notify the other chairs for scheduling purposes.

MUSIC DAY

We are in the final preparation days for our upcoming event. A big thank you to the teachers working behind the scenes to help our event run smoothly. Worker Instructions

Teachers and student workers enter through a side door on the left side of the building. Morning workers should plan to arrive before 8 a.m. We will have a brief meeting to review job assignments and answer questions. Before November 11, review your job description sent with the teacher work schedule and share it with your student volunteers. Afternoon workers should arrive by 12:30. We will have a brief meeting with afternoon workers. Every year our student volunteers make a significant contribution to the success of Music Day. Please make sure that the student volunteers know what time to arrive, and that that they are included in the worker meetings.

In-Person Instructions

Students should bring their filled in Rating Sheet (your teacher number should be on the back) and their music, with measures numbered. Masks are not required but are welcome. Keep in mind that parents are to wait for their children in the waiting room.

Virtual Instructions

The Registration Receipt you received via email when first registering your student has a link on it that allows you to edit your registration. Each teacher should edit the virtual registration for individual students, adding the performance links. You can get the link by clicking on the YouTube "share" tab and copying the link. The deadline to provide video links is Tuesday, November 7, 2023. A filled-in rating sheet and photocopy of the music must be provided to Kathy Dawal.
