#### February Meeting

Our next meeting will be at PianoWorks on Wednesday, February 28. Dr. Alan Woo will be giving a presentation.

#### **GENERAL INFORMATION:**

Each pre-college piano or piano concerto participant in GMTA's local, regional, and state auditions is required to take and pass one of the three (3) theory exams ("GATEs") in order to advance beyond local auditions. Students may become EXEMPT from taking some or all of the GATEs. 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### Local Auditions - Piano 4-11

We had 101 students register this year, which is a 25% increase above last year's registrations. We added a third judge to accommodate the number of entrants. The judges are Vicente Della Tonia, Jerico Vasquez, and Geoffrey Haydon for February 17 at Piano Works. Thank you to Pam Asberry at Piano Works for coordinating the arrangements there. Each of the 27 teachers is serving as a worker and I want to thank all of them in advance for their wonderful cooperation in fulfilling their role. The student schedule has been sent to teachers. Please tell your students their ID #. Judges will not know them by name.

There are some new things this year. Comment sheets from judges will be emailed to each teacher. The judges will be typing their comments on their personal device so teachers can not retrieve them at auditions AND we may not be able to let all teachers know if their students are OPR since we must enter the theory test into the new administrative program Tenuto before they are designated OP or OPR. No money will be exchanged at Auditions. The fee for Regionals will be sent directly to GMTA and the fee for trophies will be sent online to the person who is coordinating the optional trophies.

Each GMTA Regional registration is \$30 with a one time teacher fee of \$20. Regional registration has to be done by the teacher by February 28 online. Regional video recordings must be sent to GMTA by March 22. Go to <u>GeorgiaMTA.org</u> for details.

IMPORTANT NOTE: Teachers, take note if you have entered students with repertoire that exceeds the amount of time allotted by GMTA. Please prepare your students for a possible/probable stop in their audition due to time restraints. Allotted maximum times for the audition: 4-5 grade is 8 minutes, 6-8 grade is 10 minutes, and 9-11 grade is 12 minutes. For example, a 7th-Grade student may program two pieces totaling 15 minutes in length, with the understanding that the judge will hear a maximum of 10 minutes of the program. Judges may stop a student on either or both pieces before the maximum time has expired in order to write comments.

MY CERTIFICATION JOURNEY By Cathy Thacker, NCTM

The first time I heard about MTNA certification was over a decade ago when Robin Engleman, NCTM, gave a program to our GCMTA members about becoming certified. I was intrigued at the time because it sounded very appealing, but I was also afraid because it sounded like a lot of work. I decided to shelve the idea because I was too busy raising children, teaching lessons, and playing piano for my church. There just wasn't time left over to pursue certification. Besides, I already had a college degree, so why was certification necessary?

A few years after Robin did her program, she asked for any of us who were interested in certification to meet with her at a local Panera. I went because I love Panera, and there was no real commitment. Once again, I was challenged to raise my level of professionalism to a higher level. This time I decided to follow through and embarked on the path to certification. That fall I received a grant from GMTA towards that goal, and the die was cast!

I enlisted the help of a local legend, David Watkins, an MTNA Nationally Certified Master Teacher, to mentor me. It had been years since I had performed on a serious level, and my theory knowledge and skills were not where they should be. Taking private lessons with David and having him review my written material was very nerve-wracking at first, but I learned so much from him, and he was supportive and encouraging every step of the way. He was a wonderful mentor!

Some people push certification as a tool for making more money, and it is a legitimate reason to charge higher rates than average. Others tout the professional respect it affords you from your colleagues, and that is true as well. The main reason I pursued certification, though, was to learn on a deeper level and to understand music like I never had before. I was awarded NCTM in September 2014, and I'm at the halfway point of becoming permanently certified. I like the fact that MTNA holds me accountable each year for re-certification with their points system.

Certification taught me about repertoire, theory, new approaches to teaching, the value of professional development, patience, and that undervalued characteristic called determination. I am so glad that I invested the time to become an MTNA Nationally Certified Teacher of Music in Piano! I'm very happy to meet with anyone who has questions, doubts, or concerns, because I did, too, and maybe I can help you in some way.
