MTNA presented a webinar in April entitled "Health, Wellness, and Wholeness in the Music Studio" which is actually the title of a new book by Gail Berenson, Linda Cockey, and Charles Turon. The authors hosted the webinar and announced that they would be giving away a couple of copies of the book to attendees. Lo and behold, I received an email a few days later saying that I had won a book. Yippeee!

Chapter 1 begins with a quote from Frances Clark: "When you're teaching, you're teaching first the student, second, you're teaching music, and third, piano." She was a piano teacher, but this concept would apply to any musical instrument. The book seeks to address the social, psychological, and behavioral aspects relevant to the study of music.

When you think about it, the 30 minutes to an hour that you spend with a student may be the only one-on-one time that a student has with an adult during the entire week. The undivided attention is precious. If a student comes to a lesson upset, sad, or has any range of emotions it is almost impossible to focus on the task at hand. I have learned to try to meet my students where they are. Consequently, at various times I have worn many hats during lessons: counselor, nurse, substitute mom, you name it. I have dispensed alcohol prep pads, bandaids, cough drops, water bottles, and hugs. Usually, with this attention to the student's immediate needs, we are able to move on to music generally and piano in particular.

I am looking forward to seeing you at our first meeting on September 24!

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

Jr. Club Rosters and Payment are Due October 15th

Now it is time to compile our Student Rosters and submit our Jr. Club Registration form and fees online.

2025. Registrations received late are automatically assessed a \$50 late fee.

Please follow the steps below to register your Jr. Club for your District (West, Central, or North Gwinnett). I have also created a brief video tutorial for you if you prefer to see the steps in video form. (It is 7 mins)

- 1) Go to https://georgianfmc.org
- 2) Select 'Membership' and drop down and click on 'Membership Area' (the password is georgiapeach)
- 3) Select the link for Jr Club Registration Form
- 4) Complete the online Form
- the name of the Junior Club is your studio name or your name (whatever you have used in past years)
- enter your name for Counselor/Teacher
- enter West, Central, or North Gwinnett for your GFMC Senior club
- enter West, Central, or North Gwinnett for the Festival in which your Jr Club members participate
- enter one student name at a time (alphabetically) and click Add New to continue entering student names for all students who will be participating from your studio
- your total fee will be automatically calculated, so click on 'Proceed to Payment Screen' to make a secure Credit Card payment for your Jr. Club Registration
- 5) You will receive a confirmation email from GFMC with your payment and roster listed. You are to forward this to your festival chair. No handwritten or typed rosters to your chairman are acceptable.

That's it! Your Jr. Club will be registered. Remember that the deadline to register your Jr. Club student rosters and payment online is October 15th, 2025.

General Information

Each pre-college piano or piano concerto participant in GMTA's local, regional, and state auditions is required to take and pass one of the four (4) theory exams ("GATES") in order to advance beyond local auditions. Students may become EXEMPT from taking some or all of the GATEs. For exemption information, practice exams, and other important information regarding the GATE visit the GMTA website at: http://georgiamta.org/

APPLICATION INFORMATION

Registration for the **GMTA Theory Test** is only available **ONLINE** at the GMTA website: http://georgiamta.org/.

MUSIC DAY

Registration is now open! While the information on the website may not have been updated yet, all information on the registration form is correct.

<u>Registration is the same for all students.</u> Teachers will register individual students on our online registration form.

You must select either virtual or in-person for each student.

You may put students in either category. It is an individual choice, not a studio choice. Registration fees are the same for in-person and virtual performance.

You will receive an emailed registration receipt for each individual student. You must keep this receipt. You may use the Edit link on the receipt to make any changes to your registration up until registration closes.

The website may not be updated, but the form is. All requests should be added on the registration, **not emailed**. Up until registration closes, please do not email requests as these are hard to keep track of. Once the schedule goes out, you may only request a change from in-person to virtual performance.

If you have scheduling requests:

Changes should be made on the registration form. Use the edit tab on the registration receipt. **Not emailed.**

No requests for schedule changes other than to virtual after the schedule is mailed out.

Make sure that you have a receipt for each student registered. If you do not, after checking your spam/junk file, contact Kathy Dawal: kdawal81@gmail.com

Once registration is closed, and up to the Wednesday before the event, in-person students may switch to virtual. Contact Kathy Dawal to arrange: kdawal81@gmail.com
Virtual students cannot switch to in-person after registration closes.
