### General Information

**Each pre-college piano or piano concerto participant** in GMTA's local, regional, and state auditions is **required to take and pass** one of the four (4) theory exams ("GATEs") in order to advance beyond local auditions. Students may become EXEMPT from taking some or all of the GATEs. ## FEDERATED: VIRTUAL EVENT

The final day possible for students to switch to the Virtual event is March 8, 2026. All scores (with measures numbered) and rating sheets must be delivered to Kathy Dawal by March 9, 2026. All scores and rating sheets will be returned to the teacher at the March meeting or may be picked up before that time. Further information will be provided.

Uploading Recorded Student Performances for the Virtual event: Deadline March 12, 2025

For a rating, music must be memorized and no music score should be visible on screen.

The performer's face and hands must be visible at all times in the video. For more advanced students, making face, hands, and feet visible in the video is best.

No editing, zooming, or panning is allowed.

Each piece must be one continuous shot/video. No editing or combining.

Name each of the two recordings using your level, student name (last\_first) and choice or required. For example:  
 E4\_Smith\_John\_Choice; E4\_Smith\_John\_Required

## PREPARING FEDERATED DOCUMENTS

By now, you all are likely in the final stages of memorizing and polishing pieces with your students. One final step is to get your documents prepared. Please remember that all students must bring either commercially printed, or purchased digital copies of their music. Don't forget to number the measures! And, keep in mind that no photocopies are allowed, nor is there a provision for leaving music for students at any of the desks. If siblings are sharing music, please coordinate with the parent/caregiver to make that happen and note it in the scheduling notes box in the registration form.

Each student must have a rating sheet printed from Vivace. There are two ways to print your rating sheets. If you only need to print a rating sheet for one student, you can do it from within "My Students." If you need all your rating sheets, there is an easier, quicker way. Both methods are outlined below.

To print out individual rating sheets:

Log in to Vivace.

From the Home page, click on "My Students"

For each student, go to the Action column. Click on the third icon (Go to Performances List).

On this new page, the top listing is for our 2026 event. In the action column, click on the Adobe icon.

Your rating sheet will be downloaded to your downloads file on your computer.

Clicking on the downloaded document will open it, allowing you to print it out.

To print out rating sheets for your entire studio:

Log in to Vivace.

From the Home page go to Festivals

Select "Central Gwinnett"

From the Action column, select the third icon (Download Rating Sheets). My document opened into a new screen. From there, you can print it out, or save it to your computer.

- Judging is closed and parents are not allowed to sit in on performances

## REGISTERING YOUR STUDENTS FOR FEDERATED FESTIVAL

January 30, 2026 is the deadline for registering your students for Federated Festival. Please follow these steps:

Log in to your Vivace account at: <https://festivals.nfmc-music.org/login.php>

If you do not have an account, please contact your festival chair. For Central, it is Kathy Dawal or Lisa Ogg.

Click on: My Students. Find the student you wish to register. Under the action column, click on the second icon. (Register for Festival).

On the pop-up box, click "Select" for the Central Gwinnett Festival.

On the next box, select the event, such as "Piano Section," Violin Section."

Then select the specific event, such as "Piano Solo." Then select the level. Then click on Register.

Fill out the required boxes on this page.

Information we need:

Siblings: We need first and last names of siblings, duet partners, accompanists, etc.

Scheduling Notes:

If your student is in the high school competition, participating virtually, or playing out of district, note it in this box. If the student has a time conflict and needs to play a.m., or p.m., or during a certain time window (such as between 10 a.m., and 2 p.m.) put that here.
